

# Both Sides Now: Getting Your Book Published led by Lesley Choyce

Lesley Choyce will discuss all aspects of getting a book published from both the author's point of view and from the publisher's perspective. He'll offer practical advice for first-time authors and professionals based on nearly 50 years of experience in publishing and some thoughts on the current state of writing and publishing in Canada. The advantages and pitfalls of self-publishing will be discussed, and he will be happy to answer any questions about manuscript submissions and the book publishing process.

Bring a pen and notebook, and we'll share our ideas about memoir being an opportunity for personal growth and renewal.

# Let's Get Organized: How to Create a Simple Visual Book Outline led by Gina N. Brown

Have great ideas for a book, but now you're staring at a blank page wondering how on earth to get started? For some writers, the biggest hurdle is the inbetween stage, when many story ideas, characters, plotlines and details are floating around in their heads. 
